

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today I would like to take a moment to share one of my experiences of praying with my favorite scripture verses in this way. Of all the books in the Bible, my favorite chapter of any book is John 17. I like to think of John 17 as the "Gospel of the Gift." At least six times in John 17, Jesus explicitly refers to those you have been given to him. In particular, John



17:6 says, "They belonged to you [Father] and you gave them to me" and John 17:24 says, "Father, they are your gift to me." The more I sat with this chapter of John, the more I was drawn to the reality that Jesus was speaking about me to the Father when he said these words. Once I realized that Jesus was calling me the gift, I was able to sit back and ask the question, "What does this mean and what does it say about me?"

From these questions, the following two points began to really speak to my heart: the first is about our identity and the second is about our relationship with the Father. First, we are the Father's gift to Jesus. The Father gave us to the Son at the foundation of the world and then Jesus came to die for us so that he may give us back to the Father. That alone is enough to sit with for the rest of our lives but it gets even better! This exchange between the Father and the Son tells us that our very identity is gift. Therefore, not only are we a gift to Jesus from the Father, but we are also a gift to everyone we encounter! Now, of course, we are not to see this in an arrogant way but we are to believe this in the core of our being. Before anything we do or say, we are a gift. We are the beloved. When we begin to see ourselves as gifts, we begin to allow our insecurities to fade away and recognize that we have something valuable to give to the world, ourselves.

From this reality flows the second point, all is given to us as a gift from the Father. My weaknesses and my gifts, those that I find it easy to love and those that drive me crazy, all are gifts from the Father. Now, to receive a gift means there is a Giver and the possibility of a relationship with that person. If we see everything as a gift from the Father, then we will always be attentive to our relationship with the Father and we will respond with awe and gratitude. This is truly the secret to childlike faith and trust. For we know the Father gives all good gifts and will work all things for our greater good.

From these two points we can develop an entire way of viewing the world. If I am a gift given to the world by the Father and everything is given to me as a gift from the Father, then everyone I encounter must also be gifts given by the Father. If this is the case, then I must treat them as the gifts that they are so that they will know their identity as well.

My invitation to you today is to spend some time in prayer before the Lord, asking him to open your eyes to the reality of the gift. Father, I am your gift. Help me to rest into this identity.

Father, everything you've given me is a gift. Help me to always remain attentive to this reality so that I may help others to see that they too are gifts from you.
